## **Activity Updates**

#### **Business Function Model and Information Exchange Working Group**

On 18th October a launch meeting was held for the Business Function Model and Information Exchange Working Group, (BFM&IE WG). For some time, the Defence Support CIO, Richard Puttick has had a team of architects led by Andy Burden developing a business function model for Defence Support. This has now reached such a level of maturity that it is time to engage industry in validating the model and for a joint MOD and industry team to develop it further

Further meetings are being planned to begin the detailed work on the model. The TDI lead for this work is the Delivery Continuity Executive, [Paul Hudson](#).

#### **Multi Domain Integration (MDI)**

October has seen the positive progression of the MDI working group under the new leadership of Graham Ball, UK StratCom's Head of MDI Change Programme, and Chris Parker, Industry Lead (Day job Director Government Strategy - Fortinet UK). Under Graham and Chris's leadership, TDI's MDI activity moves to a 'low cadence / high calorific value' of greater strategic value to the UK and MDI.

On the 4th of October, the working group explored UKStratCom Multi-Domain Integration (MDI) Change Programme status, the maturity of DE&S's contribution to integration, plus introduced the new leadership team. The session outputs can be found [here](#).

However, in summary the event offered the following takeaways:

**Acquisition:** Significant challenge from both industry and MOD that to enable and support MDI, the current acquisition processes are not fit-for -(including lacking agility) to meet both the operational demand signal and emerging innovation needs.

**Leadership:** Concern that MOD processes will prevent MDI capability being optimised. The nervousness from the attendees was that MDI will be process (bureaucracy) led, rather than leadership-led and process-enabled.

**Operations:** Challenge was placed by the audience on the need for operational vignettes and pilot activities, to challenge through experimentation the ability to deliver integrated capability. Industry is keen to understand and support, and the long-held ambition to look afresh at shared problem sets needs to be revisited

**Structure:** There was unease within the attendees that historical paradigms and organisational structures will be the blocker to MDI excellence and optimum benefit.

**Funding:** It was felt that visibility and focus of integration funding would demonstrate the seriousness of the MDICP and the opportunity for industry to contribute. It was also felt that the perception remained that if integration was in the pennies and exquisite capabilities were in the billions then MOD isn't really committed.

**Purpose:** Whilst the "Why" and "What" of MDI have been demonstrated, further clarity on the architecture is required. This would allow the passionate designers and builders to translate and build the concept into an operational and beneficial solution.

The 4 October event was followed by our working group supporting a RUSI MDI event, with the MDI Working Group providing 5 attendees including 3 panellists within the exploratory session of the conference.

If you want to influence the future and shape of the working group, Chris, Graham and Steve Worsnip want to receive your inputs, because the working group leadership are keen to facilitate the delivery of this essential capability, particularly in our world of constant competition.

### **Defence AI Centre (DAIC) - Production Model and Assurance (ProMA) Project – Call for Volunteers**

TD-Info will be coordinating a collaborative initiative with MOD to co-create reference AI production and assurance models for the DAIC through a series of workshops and other activities with industry partners. This work will influence the development of the DAIC by contributing industry expertise to the frameworks underpinning MOD's ambitious, safe and responsible approach to AI. Taking a through-life perspective across the wider defence enterprise, the models will support freedom-of-manoevre for the user community whilst promoting heterogeneity with respect to AI deployment, reuse, scaling, business engagement, tooling selection and platform employment. ### **Team Defence Information developing support for MOD DE&S Future Capability Group (FCG)**

TD-Info continues to actively support and assist the FCG in kick-starting key initiatives identified jointly by DE&S and MOD Front Line Commands (FLCs), this is called the **Open Innovation Laboratory (OIL)**. OIL in summary - **Joint Strategy:** Coherent, thought collaboration focal point for Industry engagement, consistent messaging, and communication across industry sectors **About:** Command focused and sponsored problems/opportunities that are outcome based to enable exploitation and acquisition of products, upgrades, and



services. **How?** By the exploitation and utilization of the most appropriate existing Working Group or community **Collaborating with:** MOD problem owners and funders, Defence Primes and OEMs, Established tier suppliers, Solution architects and systems integrators, other sector supply chain, SMEs. Current activities and those at the early planning stage include:

- **Futures Lab** - Team Defence Information is pleased to be working alongside Futures Lab, a Future Capability Group service that draws together bespoke, pan-industry and academic collaborative teams to deliver decision support to defence. Keep your eye out for events and opportunities we'll be sharing across our networks. Follow [Futures Lab on LinkedIn](#) to find out more.
- **High Value Manufacture CoE** - The launch event of the HVM CoE was hosted at AMRC Sheffield. With a broad range of attendees from across MOD, industry, and academia the discussions have helped shape the COE direction and areas for investigation. Future engagement will be facilitated through the creation of a community of interest that will be facilitated by TD Info OIL. Immediate main effort will be delivering AdM as a service (Project TAMPA), supporting the Challenge Workstream and co-chairing the digital thread. Future topics will include Advanced Materials, Composites & Light Weighting; Advanced Manufacture; In-Service Support; and Digital Thread. The next HVM COI will convene shortly.
- **Agile Commercial Practices** - Accessing talent and contracting for outcomes to deliver sprints and enable iterative development calls for new approaches to contracting. Earlier in August, 22 small focus group workshops took place imparting knowledge of different commercial framework approaches. The best practice and pitfalls of each were captured and will be used to inform FCG route to market options.
- **Application Programme Interfaces for Robotic & Autonomous Systems (API4RAS) Task** - Team Defence Information is producing a paper to generate collaboration and a call to action around Application Programme Interfaces for Robotic & Autonomous Systems (API4RAS). Through collaboration, diversity of thought and learning from across sectors we will generate valuable insight to inform FCG's direction around Modular Open Systems Approaches to robotics and automation in the battlefield. We will deliver our findings before the end of the year so please get involved, simply track our progress, or just read and exploit the outputs.
