## Defence Additive Manufacture Hackathon – 3-4 April 2023

**Defence Additive Manufacture Hackathon 3 & 4 April 23:** Dispersed collaborative teams from across sectors, from scanners and software to printers and engineers, will;

- digitally scan an item at Abbey Wood,
- transfer the scan to another member of the team for redesign
- additively produce it and then have it delivered next day back to Abbey Wood for assessment.

Those at Abbey Wood will then work on secondary challenges using a range of additive machines

**Outcomes:** To combine digital scanning, collaborative design, and additive capabilities to build resilience through multiple points of supply, mobilise the industrial base and create support advantage.

**Prizes:** The teams that reduce the part count or weight while maintaining the same fit will win. Function will not be assessed

**Team Composition:** Teams will be made up of design engineers, software, scanning and additive capabilities.

**DE&S:** those working in DE&S will get the chance to visit the i-bridge at Abbey Wood and see some of the technology first hand.

### **First STE Maintenance Group and national working group forum held online 23 February 2023**

On 23 February, the STE Maintenance Group (STEMG), who maintain the STE specification, hosted the first online forum for the STE Maintenance Group and the individual working groups (either national working groups (like the UK STE WG) or language-based working groups (Italian, Spanish, French, German). The STEMG chair, Orlando Chiarello, presented on the history, activities, and organisation of the STEMG and the working groups. This first forum was declared a success and there are plans to repeat the forum.

The purpose of the UK STE WG is to provide a national forum to discuss the STE specification, in particular, any change requests that are under discussion at the STEMG level. Ideally we need a mix of people who already use STE and those who are interested in STE to generate effective discussion on the specification. To align with the other working groups, I propose to meet twice a year, online, to discuss the open issues on the STE specification. These meetings will happen before the STEMG meetings so that I represent the UK STE WG opinions at the STEMG meeting.

### **Team Defence developing support for MOD DE&S Future Capability Group (FCG)**

TD-Info continues to actively support and assist the FCG in kick-starting key initiatives identified jointly by DE&S and MOD Front Line Commands (FLCs), this is called the **Open Innovation Laboratory (OIL)**

**Joint Strategy:** Coherent, thought collaboration focal point for Industry engagement, consistent messaging, and communication across industry sectors.

**About:** Command focused and sponsored problems/opportunities that are outcome based to enable exploitation and acquisition of products, upgrades, and services.

**How?** By the exploitation and utilisation of the most appropriate existing Working Group or community.

**Collaborating with:** MOD problem owners and funders, defence primes and OEMs, established tier suppliers, solution architects and systems integrators, other sector supply chain, SMEs. Current activities and those at the early planning stage include:

**High Value Manufacture Centre of Expertise** - The launch event of the HVM CoE was hosted at AMRC Sheffield. With a broad range of attendees from across MOD, industry, and academia, the discussions have helped shape the COE direction and areas for investigation. Future engagement will be facilitated through the creation of a community of interest that will be facilitated by TD-Info OIL. Immediate main effort will be delivering AdM as a service (Project TAMPA), supporting the Challenge Workstream and co-chairing the digital thread. Future topics will include Advanced Materials, Composites & Light Weighting; Advanced Manufacture; In-Service Support; and Digital Thread. On the 9th of February the first part of an Additive Manufacturing Hack took place which was a 'Networking and Team Formation' launch event at Babcock in Bristol. The follow-on event when the Teams come together to 'make' some parts will be on the 3rd/4th April at Abbey Wood, Bristol. Diary events to learn more about this topic are:

**Operational Energy (OpEnCoE) COI Hydrogen Network Event** – On the 16th of November, Team Defence Information facilitated an event for Future Capability Group on Hydrogen within the context of Operational Energy at Rolls-Royce, Filton, Bristol. This event investigated developments in hydrogen as a potential energy vector and brought together different sectorial view presentations from Rolls-Royce, BP, Ryze Hydrogen, European Marine Energy Centre, and UK KTN. Additionally, the MOD – Future Capability Group, Defence Strategic Fuels Authority, Support Transformation and DASA also presented on areas of relevant activity from their perspective. Following the speakers in the morning, the 83 attendees also joined a very useful and productive networking lunch and afternoon workshop on this topic.

**Agile Commercial Practices** - Accessing talent and contracting for outcomes to deliver sprints and enable iterative development calls for new approaches to contracting. Earlier in August 22 small focus group workshops took place imparting knowledge of different commercial framework approaches. The best practice and pitfalls of each were captured and will be used to inform FCG route to market options.

**Application Programme Interfaces for Robotic & Autonomous Systems (API4RAS) Task** – Team Defence is producing a paper to generate collaboration and a call to action around Application Programme Interfaces for Robotic & Autonomous Systems (API4RAS). Through collaboration, diversity of thought and learning from across sectors we will generate valuable insight to inform FCG's direction around Modular Open Systems Approaches to robotics and automation in the Battlefield. We will deliver our findings before the end of the year so please get involved, simply track our progress, or just read and exploit the outputs.
