Defence Command Paper (Refresh) 2023

- 1. Defence has the opportunity to do things differently: learn lessons from Ukraine, adapt to evolving threats we face, and champion closer integration with our allies and partners. We will deliver a force that is credible at deterring threats, defends the homeland and our Allies, and will fight and win if needed. We will also be taking a campaigning approach to global competition.
- 2. We need a shift in Defence mindset, with increased focus on the areas that give us our strategic advantage.
- 3. Our operational approach has new focus and direction, allowing Defence to prioritise investment and activity in the areas which provide our ability properly to deter, defend and compete in the world.
- 4. Our workforce needs are changing quickly, and we must respond with a new employment model and skills framework.

Defence Command Paper (Refresh) 2023

- 5. Technology is changing quickly, and we must respond with a renewed focus on science and technology, placing it at the heart of our force design and capability development.
- 6. The battlespace is changing quickly, and so we must respond with a new partnership with industry and a focus on delivering rapidly upgradeable capability more quickly.
- 7. The threat is changing quickly, inescapably requiring us to do more, and **so we must be ruthless** in seeking productivity gains to allow us to meet that demand.
- 8. Our ability to sustain the fight and achieve the ambition set out in DCP21 will not derive from announcing more fighting platforms, but from investment in the strategic enablers, infrastructure and stockpiles needed to make our capabilities resilient and credible; those are the things that underpin real deterrence.

Overall DSEI 23 theme: **Achieving the Integrated Force**

Supported by five sub-themes that will endure across theatres and domain exhibition stands:

- Delivering the Cyber strategy and technology
- Situating technology innovation in defence to improve integrated capabilities
- Agile acquisition and rapid delivery
- Training and talent management
- Sustainability and climate change

The Integrated Force will:

- Be Integrated across Maritime, Land, Air, Cyber & Electromagnetic and Space domains, and be capable of conducting synchronised and simultaneous effects across multiple domains and levels of warfare – from the tactical to the strategic.
- Enable Integrated Action in support of national objectives.
- Be fused with the whole of Government the integrated approach - using all levers of power, able to act in unison with allies and international partners and supported by our industry partners.
