

### SME Engagement at Team Defence Information Tony Butler,

Advantage is an essential criterion in any competitive environment. The coming month will help us understand the benefits that agile thinking, zero-day set pieces and fast, accurate ball control might contribute to this year's Webb-Ellis cup-winners' competitive supremacy; however, it's also likely that the lumbering might of an amply resourced, well-found pack will be an equally critical ingredient. And so it is with the Defence industrial landscape: a balance of nimble, innovative SMEs along with the predictable, dependable heft of the primes is required to deliver a competitive advantage for the UK - both militarily and in business. Amongst the findings uncovered in the AIEG's recent investigation into Al production and assurance models for the Defence Al Centre, was the criticality of the 'best athlete' in delivering an operational advantage in AI capability. The report concluded that this was more likely to be found amongst the SME (particularly micro and university start-up) businesses than in the large platform manufacturers. TD-Info has a good track record in supporting SMEs and actively seeks opportunities to promote the interests of small- and microbusinesses amongst our membership.

Over time, MOD has become increasingly reliant on prime contractors to flow down government spending to their supply chains – and so discharge policy obligations to disperse between a quarter and a third of departmental spending with SMEs (depending on the Department – 25% in the case of Defence). Some primes, and technology focused organisations, are going further with their own initiatives to encourage more collaborative working with SMEs. Such ventures are essential if UK Industry is, collectively, going to be able to deliver the competitive edge demanded by our front-line users – and by the UK economy.

Whilst simple to outline as an intention, there are a number of significant challenges to be resolved before these aims may be fulfilled. For example, IP – the life-blood of smaller businesses - must be rigorously protected and carefully managed to ensure that incentives for SMEs to continue to engage are maintained. Improved visibility of SME capabilities – along with, where appropriate, opportunities for users to share views on their needs – is vital if the 'best athletes' are to be brought to bear. Barriers-to-entry must be minimised and corresponding commercial measures must be streamlined to allow for swift transactions and rapid on-, off-, and re-boarding. Commercial X is heading in this direction of travel and we look forward to learning more about how a set of new, agile, commercial good-practices will be implemented.

TD-Info is planning a series of showcase events and is working with a number of SME 'umbrella' businesses on larger scale SME engagement with events kicking off in October and November. The first of these is an SME showcase on the 26th October, comprised of 4 SME's presenting an overview of their company and capabilities, to the TD-Info Membership base – as detailed above. The second of which is an event with KARVE on 9 November (venue TBC) - with an agenda covering: expert tips to accelerate SME technology into Defence capability; case studies from successful small businesses at-work in Defence settings; risk-sensitive funding options for all TRLs; and, show-casing options directly with Defence users in the MOD BattleLab. Multi Domain Integration (MDI) Monthly Blog – August 2023 Steve Worsnip,

As we drive towards DSEI23 (now finished) the TD-Info Multi-Domain Integration (MDI) Working Group Leadership felt it would be beneficial through this blog to offer context that enables the Defence community to contribute to the important debates, specifically the MDI working group sessions on the 13th and 14th September.

Through this Blog we reinforce the mind-set change that is critical to MDI success, the importance and impact of Integration, what this means for the defence enterprise and the associated policies and functions.

Multi-Domain Integration (MDI) (JCN 1/20) is a mind-set change, driving change towards Integrated Action across Front Line Commands (Air, Land, Sea, Air, Cyber, Space) in Defence, in tandem with Partners Across Government (PAG) and with our Allies and international partners (e.g. USA/NATO). This ambition is reinforced in (UK Defence Doctrine (pages 16-18)) and was re-iterated as a policy headmark for UK Defence in the recent Defence Command Paper (Refresh) 2023. The aim for the Defence Enterprise to act in a way that is greater than the sum of its parts, through integration, will not happen by accident; Strategic Command as Defence's integrator is responsible for implementing this change.

Achieving Multi-Domain Integration is more than being better at joint operations, or simply adding more domains to the list and using them all. It means extending the range of activities available to decision makers, ensuring that the combination of available options and effects are synchronised and optimised, and that the most appropriate course of action can be employed

at tempo to create and exploit vulnerabilities in UK's adversaries. This goes beyond equipment to a mind-set shift. It is about building a strong culture to start acting, at all levels, to enable the Integrated Force to succeed.

The realisation of Multi-Domain Integration across Defence is intrinsically linked to NATO's headmark to move towards Multi-Domain Operations (MDO). In support of this ambition, UK Defence must ensure that our equipment and technology, in all domains, work seamlessly together. A commander should have a full range of military options available to choose from, safe in the knowledge that regardless of the combination, they will work. There will be a culture shift towards Industry integrating by default at every level, whether procuring or designing equipment, training, monitoring intelligence or developing operational plans, with the aim of Exploitation – and in future this may involve deploying industry and technical expertise to further forward to solve problems and generate integrated solutions directly at the point of need. There will be a need to train personnel to work together through Integrated Experimentation with our Government partners and wider Allies who together will strive for the same goal (such as CJADC2 in USA).
